


**Keenya Robertson** has advocated for fair housing and other civil rights since 1994. She is President & CEO of Housing Opportunities Project for Excellence, Inc. (HOPE, Inc.), a 29-year-old, private, Florida non-profit fair housing organization whose mission is to fight housing discrimination in Miami-Dade and Broward Counties and to promote equal housing opportunities throughout Florida. She currently serves as Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the National Fair Housing Alliance (NFHA). Prior to her tenure at HOPE, Mrs. Robertson was a Staff Attorney for the Georgia Advocacy Office's Protection and Advocacy for Individual Rights (PAIR) Program where she represented the interests of persons with disabilities in guardianship, housing, employment, public accommodation, and entitlement issues. She also worked for Metro Fair Housing Services, Inc. in Atlanta as the Project Director & Attorney for their Southern Regional Fair Housing Organizing Project, creating four new private enforcement programs in previously underserved areas of Arkansas, Mississippi, and Georgia.

Mrs. Robertson is a graduate of Florida State University and the Louisiana State University Law Center.










