Due to the efforts of all the Executive Board members, we accomplished our financial goal of raising \$5,000 to fund scholarships



for 5 deserving recipients. Many thanks to Jillian Krueger Printz for heading the Scholarship committee over the last few years and making the process efficient, fair, and rewarding.

More than half of the funds raised (\$2,825) were a result of our monthly raffles organized and executed by Tracy Carroll. Thanks to the changes made by Tracy, the raffles have become an important source of scholarship funding. We really appreciate her efforts!

The balance of the funds raised came from the Community Foundation of Broward (\$1,230) and donations from members (\$1,125). # **BWA Foundation Scholarship Recipients**

Please attend our June 10<sup>th</sup> meeting to meet this year's five scholarship recipients. Our member's generosity both with their gifts to the foundation and our monthly raffles have made it possible for these five women to continue their higher education.

We have a total of 13 applicants this year. Seven of them are applying to renew their scholarships, and the remaining six are new applicants. Five of the applicants either are attending or have been accepted at Nova Southeastern University. The others are attending or been accepted at Florida State University, Florida Atlantic University, Atlantic Technical College, the University of Miami, Howard University and Florida Polytechnic Institute.

These women's academic areas range from Biochemistry, to medical school, from Cyber Security to Communication Science & Disorders, from Dental Assisting to a Master's in Public Administration, and architectural/civil engineering.

In addition, I am pleased to announce that one of last year's recipients, Shakerra Bartley has been awarded a Fulbright to study abroad, and will be attending the meeting and speak about how our scholarship gave her the chance to win this distinguished program award.

These women are truly inspirational. They will tell you their story and in the process will make you proud of what we do as an organization.



# **Member Spotlight**



Maureen Dinnen, a Broward resident since childhood earned a BA in history from Barry University and an MS in Social Science from FSU. For 35 years she was a teacher in the Broward public schools and at Broward Community College.

Maureen was elected President of the Broward Community College Faculty Senate and the BCC United Faculty of Florida. She went on to

be the President the Florida Teaching Profession-NEA, the Florida Community College Senate Presidents and the Florida Education Association.

Maureen served two terms on the Broward School Board from 2004-2012 and as Democratic Committee Woman for Precinct 43R in 2016.

A veteran advocate for public education, she lobbied at the local, state and national levels in person and on TV and radio.

"Maureen Dinnen Day" was declared by the Broward County Commission, the Cities of Ft. Lauderdale, Oakland Park, Plantation and Wilton Manors for local contributions to education and by the City or Orlando for state contributions to education.

Awards Maureen received include: the 2004 James Davenport National Education Award, the 2007 Greater Ft. Lauderdale Chamber of Commerce Circle of Excellence for Education, and the Florida Education Foundations' 2010 School Board Member of the Year.

She served as a past Board of Directors Member of the Museum of Discovery and Science, Broward County Historical Commission, Greater Ft. Lauderdale Alliance, Broward Education Foundation, Greater Ft. Lauderdale Chamber of Commerce, Florida AFL-CIO, Florida School Boards Association, and the Florida Governor's Children and Youth Cabinet.

Currently Maureen is a member of the Ft. Lauderdale Education Advisory Board, the Ft. Lauderdale Historical Society, the Pioneer Women of Ft. Lauderdale, the Women's League of Voters, Bonnet House and Stranahan House as well as, of course the Broward Women's Alliance.

In retirement Maureen enjoys family, gardening, travel, working on family history and all those books busy days prevented her from reading.

Young At Art Museum in Davie has transformed the Knight Gallery into ArtCade, a new, black-light drenched, interactive exhibition of artist-designed arcade and video games.

Original, playable artworks will ignite nostalgia and the imaginations of gamers of all ages. New takes on arcade classics and uniquely designed videogames, many of which have been created specifically for this exhibition, offer a maze of hands-on works of art to explore, surrounded by towering fluorescent murals that conjure the retro spirit of the universally loved games of the past with a creative new twist.

Internationally recognized artists as well as well-known and emerging South Florida artists have created everything from digital, motion-based experiences to takes on timeless arcade staples like air hockey and mini golf. Student artists from Young At Art Institute's Video Game Design classes and camps exhibit their original videogames. Other immersive experiences will combine video and sound components rounding out the wide range of sensory stimulation offered by the eclectic selection of works by artists chosen for their focus on interactivity and their colorful, over the top aesthetics.

Young At Art Museum offers 2 for 1 Tuesdays where admission is buy one get one free e through Sept 30th and active duty military personnel and their families enjoy free admission through Sept 2nd as part of the Blue Star Museum Program. General admission is \$14 per person; \$12 for Broward County residents, seniors and children over age 1. ### Explore the Most Pressing Issues for Seniors at the Aging in South Florida Symposium Presented by AARP

The South Florida Institute on Aging (SoFIA) will host the Aging in South Florida Symposium presented by AARP on June 21, which will take a closer look at the challenges for our aging population while presenting helpful resources and solutions to help people thrive as they age. Interested business and governmental leaders, caregivers, educators and anyone who is concerned about an aging friend, relative or their own future is invited to attend and learn more about how we can make our South Florida communities age friendly.

The symposium will cover a broad spectrum of hot-topic issues focused around four pillars: aging with purpose, caregiving, the economics of aging and LGBT senior advocacy. Each pillar will include a variety of panel topics for attendees to choose from based on individual interests. Sessions will address areas of concern such as creating job opportunities for older workers, reframing how we talk about aging, medical marijuana education for caregivers, the needs of male family caregivers, community resources for caregivers and dementia caregivers, home sharing benefits, financial security, becoming an LGBT-friendly community and more.
